



As many of you know the Governor has called a special session for next week. Recently we have learned that she is working hard to get the Healthcare Compacts (aka medical compacts) included in the agenda but the Democratic Legislative leadership is resisting this request. Here's where the power of Indivisibles comes in.

Why is it important to do this? New Mexico has a doctor shortage and the waits for consultations, treatments and appointments are sometimes months away and getting longer. Passing the medical compacts will make it possible to have access to out of state doctors, specialists and medical professionals thru telehealth and on occasional visits to NM. States who participate have been shown to increase licensure 10-15%. (43 states participate including the states bordering NM)

But there is another more timely reason for Democrats to pass the medical compacts in the special session. New Mexico could lose out on millions of dollars simply because Democrats refuse to consider and pass the medical compacts in the special session. Losing out could inevitably mean closing of rural clinics and hospitals. The money being granted could be a lifeline for rural New Mexico – literally.


Monday, Oct 20th 4PM Ranked Choice Voting Rally











